European's Next Big Offering



A great racing picture possesses a special interest for the sport-loving British public, and in this connection Mr. Edwin J. Smith, of European Motion Picture Company, Limited, has pleasure in announcing a special view of "The Kentucky Derby," featuring Reginald Denny, at the New Oxford Theatre on Thursday, November 30th, at 11 a.m.

This new Universal Jewel pictures the great "Blue Ribbon Event" of the American turf year, and shows one of the hardest-driving finishes that have gone down in racing history as one of the greatest thrills of the track with Duke Charles, Col. Moncrieff Gordon's three-year-old, capturing the Kentucky Derby, America's greatest turf classic.

The story, which is thrilling melodrama, is not confined to racing, although it is the main theme.
